Introduction :

Blessed by his holiness Srimad Bhuvanendra Thirtha Swamiji of Kashi Mutt, visualized by Padmashree Dr. T.M.A. Pai the architect of modern Manipal, steered by the enlightened Trustees of Sri Bhuvanendra College, Karkala, Sri Bhuvanendra Residential School has taken its birth on 01-06-2001 in the midst of lavish and serene nature's greenery overlooking the imposing range of western ghats. Divinity of the saint and sublimity of the nature have rendered the campus a balanced blending of an ideal surrounding meant for the all round development of the young in their formative age. Located 3 kms far from the town, the school has the advantage of fresh breeze and unpolluted life necessary for healthy body and healthy mind of the young and the innocent. 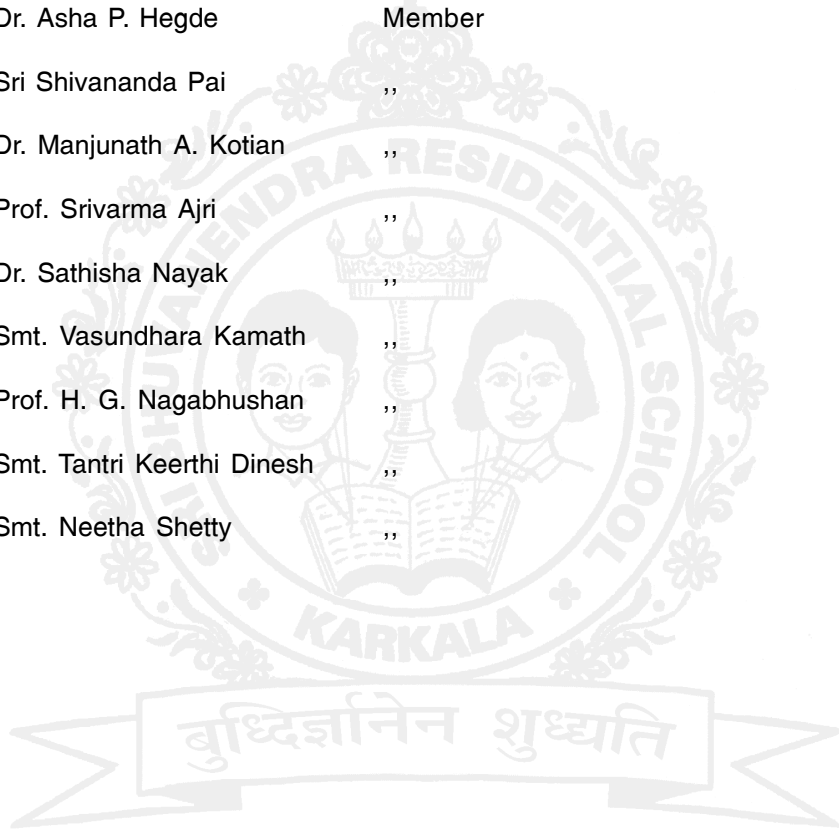

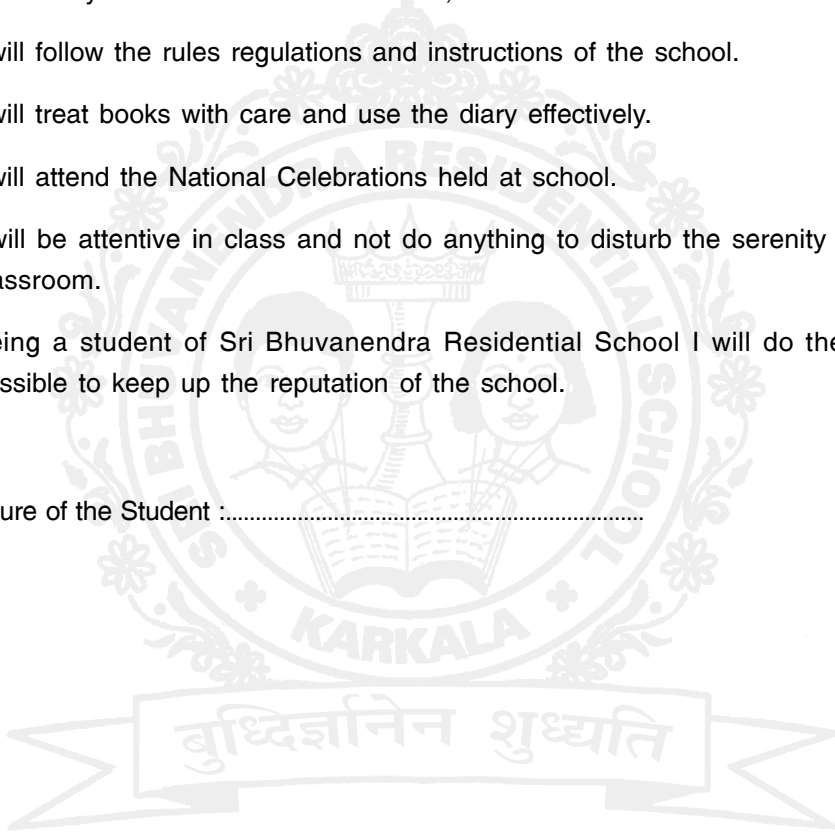

INSTRUCTION TO PARENTS AND STUDENTS

1. Attendance and Leave Rules

- a) Regular attendance in classes is a condition for promotion. A student will not be promoted to the next higher class if his/her attendance falls below 80%. Condonation is exercised only in exceptionally valid cases and that too only to the extent of 15% shortage.
- b) Please send your child to school everyday. Please don't allow your child to be absent except for health reasons or such exceptional valid reasons. Taking leave, during working days is not an acceptable practise. However, please do not send a child to school if he/she is suffering from any illness.
- c) Application for leave has to be applied for, in the School Diary, if it is for 1-2 days, and sanction obtained from the Class Teacher.
- d) **Leave for 3 days or more has to be sought by the parent in a separate application addressed to the Principal and sanction obtained.** Medical Certificate has to be submitted if it is for health reasons. The leave will be sanctioned by the Principal only if the reasons are convincing, and warrant such absence.
- e) **Leave applications sent by Email/Fax are not acceptable.**
- f) Leave shall not be taken without prior approval of the Principal, if it is for 3 or more working days, or if it is during any Test or Exam. Leave absence from any Test or Exam will be granted by the Principal only in exceptional situations.
- g) If leave is availed without prior sanction or if leave is availed inspite of the Principal refusing leave, it will be treated as a serious violation of school rules and suitable disciplinary action will be taken against the student concerned.
- h) Absence before/after vacation or long holidays will be viewed very seriously. A fine of **Rs. 500/-** per day will be levied for the same, if no prior permission is obtained by the parents from the Principal or if on return the parents do not justify the absence, to the satisfaction of the Principal.

2. Correspondence from the school

Letters sent to parents must be properly responded. Parents when summoned to School must understand that there is something very important to be discussed with them. If a parent does not respond, such a parent will be asked withdraw the child from School.

3. Parental Attention to certain disciplinary matters

- a) Parents are requested not to allow children to bring CDs, iPods, Cameras, Pendrives, Mobile Phones, Videogames or similar gadgets to the School. It may be noted that any violation of this rule will attract severe disciplinary action.
- b) Parents and students are discouraged strongly from giving any kind of gifts to teachers/members of the staff.**
- c) Students are not permitted to bring money to the School, unless there is a clear instruction from the School to bring money for a particular purpose.
- d) Bringing and distributing chocolates, junkfood, chewing gum etc., are disapproved strongly. Students shall not buy and supply any items to the hostel students.
- e) Girls are permitted to wear black hair-clips only. Colourful hair-clips, hair-bands etc., are not permitted.**
- f) Boys shall have a decent hair-cut. Long hair, and crew-cut etc. are thoroughly discouraged. Low-waist pants are not permitted.
- g) Parents have a responsibility to encourage modest, decent and tasteful dressing habits, conforming to acceptable social mores, amongst children from very early stages of their development.**
- h) Bulling is strictly prohibited inside the school premises and no such act will go unnoticed or unpunished.

PARENTS WHOLE-HEARTED CO-OPERATION IS EXPECTED IN THESE MATTERS TO MAINTAIN DISCIPLINE AND DECORUM.

4. Parents' visit to School

- a) Parents are requested to visit the school for all their transactions only during office hours on working days.
- b) Parents visiting School on a working day must go to the school office and not to Faculty rooms or Class rooms.
- c) Parents are strongly discouraged from visiting the School Staff in their residences, except in an emergency.
- d) Kindly be dressed appropriately / decently during your visit to schools.

e) **PARENTS SHALL NOT VISIT PRINCIPAL OR TEACHERS DURING MARCH AND APRIL, UNTIL THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF RESULTS, UNLESS THEY ARE SPECIFICALLY ASKED TO MEET THEM.**

f) Parents, meeting their ward's Teachers at least once in a term definitely will help their wards overall development.

5. Library and Computer Centre

Libraries and Computer Centres are two significant and integral components of the School. Students are expected to use them with great diligence and care, for their mental and intellectual nourishment.

Students shall co-operative with Library and Computer Centre staff, in maintaining order and discipline. Students shall take care not to lose, damage or deface any of the materials, fixtures, equipments that are provided. Any loss or damage will have to be replaced or made good by the student concerned.

6. Dress Code

a) All the students must be in School Uniform on all working days right from the beginning of the School Year. Students will be in uniform as shown below:

b) Students have to come to School neatly dressed to uniform. If a student doesn't wear the proper uniform he/she will have to pay a fine of Rs. 50/- per day.

c) Students have to wear the shoes and socks of his/her size. **They must have footwear as specified by the school.** Uniform shoes and socks will be worn on all day, except on rainy days.

7. Mode of Payment

Parents are requested to go through the 'Financial Information' and refer to it for all details regarding fee payments, due dates.

- a) Please note that “School fees” include Tution Fees, Special Fees, **Food charges**, Hostel charges.

No payments through cheques will be received by the School under any circumstances.

- c) Parents who do not have a designated branch in their neighbourhood are permitted to remit fees through Demand Drafts. Such Demand Drafts will have to be drawn in favour of Shri Bhuvanendra Residential School, payable at Karkala. Demand Drafts have to be sent by Registered Post, with a covering letter showing the name of the Student, Class, Roll Number and details of the fees paid.

8. Birthdays

Distribution of sweets / chocolates on birthdays is banned in the school.

9. Rainy Days

- a) June to August, being the Monsoon Season, there will be rains on most days. But the school will not be closed just because of rains. However, if there is torrential rain and consequent floods disrupting traffic, School may have to be closed. As far as possible, such closure will be notified beforehand.
- b) Students have to walk a little to the dining hall for their lunch. Please provide Umbrella, to your child during the rainy season.

10. Health

- a) Parents are requested not to send children to school if they suffer from any communicable disease. Thereafter if a doctor certifies to the effect that the child is no more like to infect others, parents, shall come with the child to the Principal to take a written permission to attend the classes.

IF A CHILD CONTRACTS CHICKENPOX, SEND HIM / HER TO SCHOOL ONLY AFTER A MINIMUM PERIOD OF FOURTEEN DAYS.

11. Working days

- a) The school follows a six day (Monday - Saturday) week schedule. There will be no regular classes on Sundays.

TIPS ON STUDY SKILLS

The following tips may help you improve your study skills.

Doing Home Work :

- Work in a quiet-well-lit place.
- Establish a regular study time.
- Have a study time every day. If nothing is assigned, just read any book.
- Turn off the TV, Radio or Stereo.
- Don't accept any unimportant telephone calls.

Managing Time :

As students, you need to keep good track of your time. A programmed time for school and out of school life will result in happy, worth while activities.

- Plan and schedule your day.
- Sequence your activities; write them down and time them.
- Prioritize your activities; you are a student, give priority to your studies.
- Consider your most alert time; use this as your study time.

Allow a study break, Experts recommend a 10-minute break every hour to rest the mind and the eyes.

- Consider study sequence.
- Alternate activities; read, then draw, then write etc.

SOME GOOD PRACTICES TO OBSERVE

1. Show due respect to prayers and national anthem.
2. Show respect to parents, elders and even to younger ones.
3. Greet others, teachers in particular.
4. Pay attention to the teachers.

5. Concentrate fully in your studies and avoid all distractions.
6. Set an achievable long-term goal.
7. Set goals for everyday and try to evaluate yourself at the end of the day.
8. Always be ready to work hard.
9. Practise values like humility, sincerity, truthfulness and compassion.
10. Extend your help only for the positive reasons.
11. Learn to appreciate others instead finding fault in others.
12. Respect yourself, as well as the opposite gender.
13. Have a healthy relationship with everyone.
14. Believe in yourself. Avoid overconfidence.
15. Observe the rules, regulations and instructions of the School.
16. Ask for permission when entering the Faculty Room.
17. Expect only guided freedom in School.
18. Avoid hurting others' feelings through words or actions.
19. Make sure that the words you utter are not offensive to others.
20. Weigh your words before you talk.
21. Remember that you have to pay for your unacceptable behaviour.

General Rules and Regulations for students

1. Student must be present in the school in time for the meditation at 8.45 a.m. Those who come to school before 8.45 a. m. should occupy their seats and engage in studies in their respective classrooms.
2. Be respectful and obedient to teachers and other staff.
3. Students is not allowed to leave the school without the prior permission of the school authorities.
4. Students should bring a letter from the Parents in case they want to leave the school earlier than the scheduled timings.
5. In case of absence, the student must submit the leave note to class teacher without fail.
6. Student must wear school uniform on all working days.
7. Do not enter any other class rooms without permission.

8. Do not remain in the class room during Physical Education, library and other co-curricular activities periods.
9. Come out of your classrooms during authorised breaks only.
10. Take care of your belongings while at school. The school will not take responsibility for any lost articles including money or valuables which are not advisable to be brought to school.
11. Keep your classrooms neat.
12. Maintain order and discipline in the classrooms and on the campus.
13. Chewing gum and Chocolates are not allowed in the school and Playground.
14. Maintain cleanliness in the toilets. Writing on the walls is strictly punishable.
15. No collection of any kind for any purpose whatsoever may be made among the students without the permission of the Principal.
16. No student will present (or exchange) any kind of gifts to the Teachers/ Students/Staff members.
17. Students are expected to be ready with the required books and stationery before the commencement of classes with upto date work.
18. Student should not lose the school diary. If they lose, they should collect a new copy by paying the amount Rs. 50/- to the school office.
19. Tours/Excursions organised by the school are compulsory for all the students.
20. Day scholars are discouraged from staying in the hostel. However in case of special circumstances such as for better preparation for the exam or when their Parents are away from the house, students can stay in the hostel with their own required arrangements and shall pay Rs. **150/-** per day.
21. Mobile Phones are strictly prohibited. If found they will not be given back.
22. All students should take active part in the school activities and assist the school authorities in the organisation of co-curricular programmes, in maintaining discipline and in enriching the glory of the Institution. They must always set an example for others by their politeness, courtesy and good conduct.
23. Stationery articles and text books must be used with great care.
24. Strict action will be initiated against those found writing on the walls, possessing obscene literature, using bad causing any damage to the school properties.

SUGGESTIONS TO PARENTS

1. You are required to co-operate with the school authorities in all matters concerning the education of your ward and the school discipline.
2. Make a conscious effort for the cleanliness of your child.
3. Send your child regularly and in time to the school.
4. Get daily information about studies/programmes in the school.
5. Kindly fix a particular study time for your ward to ensure regularity and to make him/her to follow it as a daily routine.
6. Control the use of TV but encourage the child to observe the Educational programmes.
7. Help the child to develop some hobbies.
8. Don't send the child to school when he/she is sick.
9. Please do not come to the school during the school hours to meet the teachers or to take the child away.
10. Don't allow the child to have any valuable items when coming to school.
11. Don't call to the child during school hours. If it is genuine emergency the Parent may call to the Principal.
12. Please make sure that your ward behaves in disciplined manner and if your ward violates the rules and regulations of the school, the school authorities can take any disciplinary action against the student.
13. Parents are not supposed to give any extra pocket money and valuables to the students.
14. Parents are expected to attend the P.T.A. meetings and various functions organised in the school whenever they are invited for the same.
